## s.94(a) (NSW) Crimes Act

s 94 (a) robs or assaults with intent to rob any person,

(b) steals any chattel, money, or valuable security from the person of another

Maximum penalty: 14 years

Amended on 2.7.2018 to distinguish the two offences by letters (a) and (b)
