

## Murder: 2005

**Maximum Penalty: Life - s.19A (NSW) Crimes Act**

**Standard non-parole period**

**20 years:** all offences committed on or after 1.2.2003

**25 years:** offences committed on or after 1.2.2003 where victim was a police officer, emergency services worker, correctional officer, judicial officer, health worker, teacher, community worker, or other public official, exercising public or community functions and the offence arose because of the victim's occupation
