

## Aggravated Robbery

s.95 (NSW) Crimes Act

s 95 Robs, or assaults with intent to rob, any person, or steals any chattel, money, or valuable security, from the person of another, and immediately before, or at the time of, or immediately after such robbery, assault, or larceny from the person, strikes, or uses any other corporal violence to any person

**Maximum Penalty: 20 years**

**Substituted: 23.12.1994:**

s 95 (1) Robs, or assaults with intent to rob, any person, or steals any chattel, money, or valuable security, from the person of another, in circumstances of aggravation

(2) Circumstances of aggravation:

(a) alleged offender uses corporal violence on any person,

(b) alleged offender intentionally or recklessly inflicts actual bodily harm on any person,

(c) alleged offender deprives any person of his or her liberty.
